During our September Meeting, Moms kicked off the new program year with a Back to School celebration. 83% of Moms participated via Zoom! We began with Breakout rooms to discuss our Back to School experiences. Th'e topics that were discussed included setting up virtual classrooms at home and preparing to support our children throughout the school year.

In October, Moms recognized Breast Cancer Awareness Month by wearing pink attire and adorning their personal spaces with pink accents. We hosted special guest Teisha Bouler who is a Breast Cancer Survivor. Ms. Bouler shared her Breast Cancer journey and educated us about the importance of regular screening. Ms. Bouler's story was inspirational and prompted a few moms to schedule their screenings.

73% of Moms were present and we voted on a recommendation from the executive board for a \$100 assessment toward our philanthropic work. We also reviewed and voted on 7 Amendments to the MVP bylaws.




GG2 - Intro to Astronomy with Professor Julien

In October, Grade Group 2 enjoyed activities with Professor Julien, a current high school and George Washington University student who is also an explainer for the Smithsonian Air & Space Museum. Host Moms Sabine Balzora, Kimberly Matthews, and Kerrien Suarez supported our budding astrophysicists as they explored space, time and the motion of celestial bodies from the comforts of their own homes. They are now equipped with their Star Wheels and are ready to navigate the night sky!

Grade Group 2 also enjoyed an exciting hour of interactive learning on leadership and civic duty in the month of November. Dr. Carlene Reid, candidate for Ward 8 Member of the District of Columbia State Board of Education, explained the voting process and ways that children are able to get involved in their community and student government. GG2 learned why it is important to use their voices at an early age to facilitate change in their school, community, and abroad.

Children voted in a mock election and enjoyed the opportunity to ask questions about the process. As the activity adjourned, the children received an election activity and chapter book about a student election along with a cool leadership affirmation pencil to remind them of who they are.



GG3 - Wacky Science with Ms. Cristi

oms Dashia Wilson, Pershelle Cambrell, and Stacy Carter hosted Grade Group 3 activities in October with STEM Science teacher and Cake War's two-time champion, Cristi Simmons. Children mixed secondary colors and made water defy gravity. They also tested their knowledge of energy absorption while whipping up ice cream in a bag. It was a fun dive into the Sciences for Grade Group 3.

The late Congressman John Lewis was a pioneer of civic advocacy and leadership who encouraged us to use our voices for good and to "make good trouble." In November, Grade Group 3 followed his model to confidently use their voices with the direction and instruction of Greg Watkins who is a vocal coach. Mr. Watkins taught the children about the Four Keys to consider when learning to use their voices. These keys include: Practice, Confidence, Preparation, and Just Do It.

Mr. Keys taught the children a melody and allowed a few songbirds to use their voice to sing. The children also voted electronically and they used their voices to support their vote. The activities concluded with a rousing Kahoot game that reviewed the key points learned.

GG4 - STEAM Yak Attack

Community Service

In September, MVP started the 2020-2021 program year by intentionally impacting children in our community. On Tuesday, September 22, 2020 we impacted 20% of the 500 children in care by donating over 100 backpacks to the Prince George's County Department of Social Services, Foster Care & Adoptions. The backpacks were stuffed with items to assist children with virtual learning as well as items that were donated by Alluzion Designs to protect against COVID-19. Our donation efforts equipped over 100 children from Pre-Kindergarten through 12th grade with the tools necessary to successfully start the school year.



During the month of October MVP Moms served our community by supporting early voters during the 2020 historic general election. MVP logged over 30 hours of service from October 26 through November 2, 2020 during our Poll Volunteer initiative. MVP families showed pride in the community by providing water and snacks to voters and poll workers across Prince George's County as they fulfilled their civic duty.





VP families donated over 1,000 cans, logged 125 service hours, and ultimately impacted over 2,000 families for the "We Canned Hunger" initiative. On Sunday, November 22, 2020, 13 MVP teens, mothers, and fathers participated in Project GiveBack. Families sorted food items, built boxes, filled them with food items and delivered food baskets to less fortunate families within our community.



In preparation for Project GiveBack, MVP members hosted a grade group pound challenge to raise a minimum of 200 canned foods per group to be donated to Project GiveBack. Grade Group 4 donated over 1,100 canned food and walked away with the coveted "We Canned Hunger" award!

partnered with Girls' Night Out (GNO) by Shawn to achieve the goal diminishing food insecurities during the Thanksgiving holiday. Twenty catered meals to transitioning veteran families and families within Prince George's County public housing were delivered. Through our efforts, MVP and GNO continue to provide families with a sense of peace during an unprecedented time.



In December, MVP continued its partnership with the Prince George's House Men's Shelter and delivered over 35 Blessing Bags during the holiday season. The 2nd Annual Blessing Bag delivery provided MVP an opportunity to continue to impact residents of our community. The bags were stuffed with hygiene products as well as Personal Protective Equipment to provide protection against COVID-19.

In partnership with GNO, MVP presented over 100 toys to families within the Housing Authority of Prince George's County. MVP Teens served as elves during the toy distribution! GNO also provided over \$500 in monetary contributions to fulfill Christmas Wishlists for families who receive public housing!



MVP's goal of providing One Warm Coat to an underserved child was fulfilled by donations from GNO. Due to GNO's generous donation we were able to keep over 20 children within the care of Prince George's Department of Social Services, Foster Care warm this winter!



in September 27, 2020 more than 100 MVP Moms and their guests joined the Power Brunch to celebrate the contributions of Dr. Monica Goldson, Chief Tiffany Green, Cheryl Petty Garnette, and Tonia Wellons to the Prince George's County Community. Broadcast journalist Taylor Thomas was a gracious Mistress of Ceremonies, leading the honorees in an engaging discussion of how they balance the demands of high-power careers and motherhood amidst the pandemic.

Taylor awarded several door prizes that were generously donated by MVP Moms, and crowned MVP Mom Monica Miller winner of the afternoon's Opulent Hat Contest. Entertainment was provided by MVP children Christian Austin (violinist), Channing Pridgeon (spoken word), and Mackenzie Perry (spoken word). Then candidate, Kamala Harris debated Vice President Mike Pence on critical questions such as the economy, race, education, and healthcare. A total of 30 Moms attended the interactive event, which included polling questions and live chat discussion. During the event we played Vice Presidential Debate Watch Party Bingo, provided commentary, and enjoyed witnessing this significant event together from the comfort of our homes.

The Legislative Committee hosted Part II of the Women's Empower Voter Roundtable on October 8, 2020. Several local community advocates were invited to participate in the event. Delegate Julian Ivey (District 47A), Chonya Johnson (The 5 Minute Advocate), Monica Roebuck (Alternate Member of the MD State Board of Elections), and Gideon Epstein (Election Protection) served as our featured panelists.

The event was moderated by Mom Robin Brown and co-hosted by Chair Mom Benity Sewell and Co-Chair Mom Jenene Lee. Panelist discussed topics such as Question 2 on the ballot, advocacy, having a voting plan, and the importance of speaking up if we believe our rights have been violated while voting in person on Election Day. Moms left the event informed and empowered to encourage family members and friends to vote!

The Committee extends heartfelt grace, gratitude, and appreciation to all of the Moms for participating in this event and displaying a high level of engagement during this very important election year. We remained committed and involved throughout the election process by encouraging family members and friends to vote. We realized that this historical Presidential Election of 2020 served as the catalyst for ushering in the first woman and the first African American Vice-President of the United States

- 1. Present Motion Make a proposal, "I move..."
- 2. Second Motion Express support for discussion of another member's motion, "I second the motion."
- Debate Motion The members will give opinions on the motion.
- 4. Vote on the Motion The members will vote on the decision.
