LEARNING FOCUS

Reading

- In reading students will describe connections within the text, to one's self, and to the world using oral expression, drawings, labels, or role-play
- The January phonics focus skills are substituting the beginning phoneme, review spelling ck, tch, dge, ff, ll, ss, and blending phonemes
- New Heart Words: how, their, want, will, up, may, now, came, out
- The writing focus is on writing an informative (non-fiction) text

Social Studies

- Identify how people celebrate new years around the world
- Students will identify the change that happens over time
- Technology and communities shape people's lives and affect the way people live.

Math

- Students will order and compare objects directly and indirectly by comparing to a reference object
- Students will read and write time to the hour and half hour
- Students will measure objects using non-standard, iterating length units

Science

- Students will observe patterns in adults and their offsprings using evidence
- Students will explain how parents and offspring are the same and different
- Students will identify which animal is the baby and which one is the adult

Snowflake Wall Activity



Create snowflakes at home and have your child fill out a snowflake each time they finish a book. Then, have them tape the snowflake to the wall to celebrate their progress and decorate the space. As you read daily with your child have them identify the heart words in the book or spelling patterns they are learning at school.

Math at Home



Grab Bag Subtraction



Materials:

20 small objects (such as pennies or beans) and a bag

Directions:

- Player 1 chooses a number of beans to start with.
 Player 1 tells Player 2 how many beans they chose.
- Player 1 places that number of beans into the bag.
- Player 2 grabs a handful of beans and removes them from the bag. Player 2 shows Player 1 how many beans they removed.
- Both players predict the number of beans still in the bag.
