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## We are Learning...

**Reading-** In October, students will be discussing Author's purpose for fantasy genres and blending phonemes and graphemes.

\*\* At home- READ, READ, READ! Great readers are developed with constant practice. Your child should begin to be able to describe the **genre** of the stories they are reading. Ask them about the **characters**, **setting** and, **plot**. It can also be fun for readers to come up with alternate endings. Ask your student, "If you were the author, what ending would you have written?"

Math- This month's learning begins with the measurement of length. Students learn about centimeters, inches, feet, meters, estimating length, and how to select the appropriate measurement tools for various objects. We finish out the month by learning strategies to add within 100.

\*\*At home- allow your student to explore measurement around the house by measuring objects with an available measuring tool.

Science-This month, we will discuss and compare sizes of landforms. We will also create a model of a landform.



**Health-**We will explore the major parts of the **brain**, how **senses** help the **brain learn**, and respect for different **perspectives** and patterns of **thinking** 

Social Studies- Student will learn about our government and its leaders, laws, and symbols.
