Learning Focus

Reading/ Language Arts

- Letter-Sound Relationships
- Beginning Sound Isolation
- Phoneme Blending
- Letter Identification
- Students will ask and answer questions about key details in a text.
- Students will retell familiar stories, including key details.
- Identifying nouns & verbs

Social Studies

- Students will learn what is my personal history
- How do we talk about time?
What is a timeline?

Science

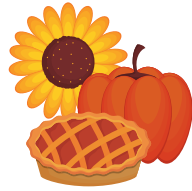
- Students will learn to compare and contrast features among different types of plants, and patterns in young and adult plants.

Math

- Students will be able to identify how plants and animals change their habitat.
- What people can do to not damage their environment?
- Recognizing numbers 1-10
- Write and recognize written symbols and quantities for at least 0-10.

Math Continued...

- Students compare numbers 0–10 using the words *greater than*, *less than*, and *equal to* by matching and counting.
- Use objects or drawings to compose or decompose numbers 1 through 10.
- Record decompositions through writing and drawing.
- Find all of the combinations that make 10, for any number 0 through 10.



Health

- Students will learn to identify healthful and less healthful foods, routines for eating healthful foods, and rules for safe food handling.

Math At Home

I Can Make...

For this activity, you will focus on a number for your child to build. Next you will give your child 2 bowls, or containers, and an item of your choice, like coins, beads, or small snacks like crackers or pretzels, etc. Then ask your child can they make a group of 4 with 2 beads? Have child continue until they have all of the combinations of 4, Once successful, move on to a bigger number.

Counting Snacks

For a yummy mathematics treat, assemble a pile of your child's favorite snack. Choose something small, such as jellybeans, gummy bears, etc. Give a snack to your child and tell them to count aloud. Give or take away some snack to show different numbers up to 10.

Reading At Home

Sound Scavenger Hunt

Choose a letter sound, then have your child find things around your house that start with the same sound.

Letter Scavenger Hunt

Make identifying letters a blast! Pick a letter and while out and about have students identify letters.
