

HOMEWORK

Location, Location, Location,

Provide your child with a well-lit, distraction-free place to do homework. Avoid the distractions of TV, phone calls and social media.

MATH

Encourage communication: Ask your child math questions and get them to teach you math.

BEING SUCCESSFUL

Ask your child (ren) about school and encourage them to talk about their day .

READING STRATEGY

Good readers carefully think about what was read. Through the use of questioning, you will be able to understand the text on a deeper level because you are stopping, thinking and processing what you are reading.

READING

This month:

Scholars will be reading:

SOCIAL STUDIES

This month we will establish a safe space in a social studies classroom. Also, answer the following questions: What problems faced the new United States after independence? How did those problems lead to the creation of the Constitution?

MATH

This month:

- Students will be introduced to exponential notation and exploration of patterns in the number of zeros of a product when multiplying by powers of 10.

Students will focus on multi-digit multiplication and later on multi-digit division.

Students practice computation in context, connected to visual representation, and arising from real-life situations. Students use their understanding of place value and the properties of operations together with number sense to choose and carry out efficient calculations that make sense.

SCIENCE

This month we are discussing how to describe matter with words and numbers. We are developing models of matter that describe extremely small particles and extremely large quantities of particles in different states. Also, we will use observations and measurements to classify materials based on their properties and describe patterns in the properties of similar materials.

HEALTH

This month, we focus on safety and injury prevention. We will discuss and practice how to handle first aid for a range of common minor injuries.
